Changing Lives Through Education

The UMRC Foundation and Porter Hills Foundation are supporting team members' career goals through competitive scholarship opportunities.

It is predicted that 30,000 additional caregivers will be needed in Michigan in 2020. Yet, caregiving has been referred to as "the toughest job," with turnover rates exceeding 80% (What It's Like to Do the Toughest Job in America, Vox, August 2019; Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2019; Home Care News, May 2019).

At UMRC and Porter Hills, our employees are an essential part of our Guiding Beliefs. We value the difference our dedicated team members make every day in the lives of older adults and recognize how important it is to nurture and offer them the training and tools to provide outstanding care to those we serve.

In 2014, the UMRC Foundation launched its **Staff Scholarship** program to offer competitive, educational scholarship opportunities for eligible team members, with priority going to those who provide direct care of those we serve. Thanks to a 5-year grant of \$500,000 in 2017 from Ellen and Bob Thompson – renowned philanthropists who are committed to changing people's lives through education – the UMRC Foundation has awarded 128 scholarships totaling \$304,587! This is virtually unheard of in the senior care industry!

We are thrilled to use this program as a model to create the **Porter Hills Employee Support Services Fund** as well. The Porter Hills Foundation team is actively pursuing the resources needed to replicate this program across the state. Over the next few months, you will hear more about this exciting endeavor which will help Porter Hills team members pursue a certification, degree, or other continuing education program to support their career goals.

In the meantime, we are delighted to share with you these stories of lifelong learning and caring for others that make UMRC and Porter Hills such special places to live and work.

She is the first in her family to attend college, thanks to the UMRC Foundation Staff Scholarship program, helping her reach her goal of becoming an occupational therapist.
