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## \$1 Million Grant to Benefit Low-Income Older Adults in Jackson, Hillsdale & Lenawee Counties

## UMRC Foundation Receives Grant from the Thome Foundation to Expand Thome PACE

**Jackson, MI, February 3, 2020** – The United Methodist Retirement Communities (UMRC) Foundation is thrilled to announce that it has received a \$1 million grant from the Edward N. and Della L. Thome Memorial Foundation, Bank of America, N.A., Trustee. This grant supports an expansion project for Thome PACE, or Program of All-inclusive Care for the Elderly, serving low-income, nursing home eligible older adults living in Jackson, Hillsdale and Lenawee counties.

"We are elated to receive this gift from the Thome Foundation in support of Thome PACE and the older adults we serve in this region," says Wendy Brightman, President of the UMRC Foundation and Porter Hills Foundation. "The UMRC Foundation is blessed to have the continued support of the Thome Foundation in our mission to provide the best possible care and services to older adults. Previous grants from the Thome Foundation totaling \$2.5 million helped launch this important project in 2016, thus named Thome PACE."

"The population of older adults continues to grow, and the three counties served by Thome PACE are no exception," says Thome PACE Board Chair Michael Shore. "Thome PACE currently serves 160 older adults and receives 35 to 40 new referrals each month. The expansion of our space is vital in order to keep up with the demand for PACE services. We are grateful to the Thome Foundation for its commitment to the needs of vulnerable older adults."

A partnership between UMRC and the Region 2 Area Agency on Aging, Thome PACE serves the social, medical, and supportive needs of low-income, older adults, ages 55 and up, who live within the PACE service area. PACE participants must be certified as meeting the State of Michigan criteria for nursing facility level of care, but be able to live safely in their homes and communities, thanks to PACE support. PACE offers a cost-effective alternative to nursing home care, providing overall savings of 40% to the State. Services are offered at the Thome PACE Day Health Center in Jackson, including comprehensive medical, occupational and physical

therapy, pharmacy needs, nutrition and meals, health education, social and recreational activities, and door-to-door transportation.

This grant from the Thome Foundation will expand the Thome PACE Day Health Center to add space for activity programming, meals, exercise and fitness, an additional care and shower room, and more. "These spaces will help us provide outstanding care for Thome PACE participants with a variety of needs," says Shore. "Seventy percent of Thome PACE participants have a behavioral health challenge, and over half are living with dementia. This expansion will provide greater access, dignity, and person-centered care for both current and future participants of Thome PACE."
