Hohman was the 2015-16 Board President of the Association of Fundraising Professionals West Michigan and has volunteered with such nonprofits as the West Michigan Salvation Army Advisory Board and the Grand Rapids Symphony Development Committee. She was also president of the East Grand Rapids School Board.
