Pamela Kidd is the Co-Chair of the Brio Living Services Quality, Ethics, and Compliance Committee. She has served on the Porter Hills Board (now Brio Living Services) since 2016.

Pamela holds a Bachelor of Arts from Pomona College and an M.D. from Baylor College of Medicine, with residency training at Duke University and the University of Washington. A pathologist with a subspecialty certification in hematopathology, Pamela retired as the Medical Director of the Hematology and Flow Cytometry Laboratories of Spectrum Health. During her career, Pamela also served Helen DeVos Children's Hospital in Grand Rapids and held a clinical academic appointment at Michigan State University College of Human Medicine.

Prior to moving to Grand Rapids in 1998, Pamela was on the faculty of the University of Washington Medical School and then on the faculty of Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, serving as Director of Hematopathology at both institutions. She is the co-author of over 100 scientific papers, book chapters, and abstracts in the area of hematopathology, primarily related to the diagnosis of leukemia and lymphoma.
